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




Brief overview of Cyprus Labour Market (1)

- Cyprus economy: small, open and flexible
- Population 15+: 636.344 in 2011
- Main drivers of economic activity: Services, Construction, Hotels and Restaurants
- Concentration in the services sector 75%, Industry 21%, Agriculture 4%
- Nationality: 78% Cypriots, 13% EU, 9% Others
- Educational attainment
 - Tertiary: 40%, Upper Secondary: 38%, Below Upper secondary: 22%

Enhancement and Modernization of CY PES (1)

Activities along 5 axis

- > Infrastructure
 - Expand the network for better coverage
 - Standardise offices (appearance, internal layout)
 - New image unique recognisable identity
- New upgraded services to the unemployed and **Employers**
 - Individualised approach services -Vocational guidance
 - Self-service services including web based services to unemployed and employers







Enhancement and Modernization of CY PES (2)

- > Development of all staff members
 - Extensive training for all staff members including study visits in targeted similar organisations abroad
- > Justification of future actions through a series of studies
 - A quality framework for the development of Private Employment Services
 - Development of active ageing policies
 - Enhancement of services to employers








Enhancement and Modernization of CY PES (3)

- > Justification of future actions through a series of studies
 - Develop targeted employment programmes for the youth
- **Publicity**
 - Inform customers, stakeholders and the public in general of the new network, services. Promote the new identity



Cyprus PES Services and Functions (1)


Services/ Functions

Highly flexible – Operate on the basis of decisions/ regulations issued by DL/MLSI rather than on Legislation

- Managing Vacancies and Matching
 - Assistance and support to: Jobseekers to find employment and Employers for filling vacancies
- Individualised services to unemployed
- Personalised support and vocational guidance to vulnerable groups to enter employment







Cyprus PES Services and Functions (2)

- Information, guidance and referrals to employment and training opportunities
- Initiation/ operation of programmes/ schemes


Currently PES has to manage:

- 36.000 registered unemployed (20% are non Cypriots)
- 15.000 vacancies/year (decreased at a rate of 20% per year during the last two years)

Measures in response to increased unemployment (1)

Measures for job creation, job retention and measures for the improvement of the employability of the unemployed

Included

- Subsidised employment schemes targeting specific groups of the population (youth, older workers, disable, Long term unemployed, vulnerable)
- **Promotion of Flexible Forms of Employment**
- **Promotion of Youth entrepreneurship**






Measures in response to increased unemployment (2)

- Training for preventing lay offs
- Training and retraining activities (horizontal and vertical competencies)
- Increase the capacity of PES
- Redirect ESF funds
